

Palliative Care Toolkit for Integrated Home Care Teams during COVID-19 Pandemic

As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, an increased need for palliative and end-of-life support in the home care setting may occur. This may be directly related to COVID-19 infection of at-risk clients already receiving home-care services or may be as a result of reduced hospice and acute care availability to support end-of life and provide palliative care

Purpose: This toolkit is designed to assist Integrated Home Care (IHC) teams with this increased need to provide palliative care and support end-of-life care for clients and their families/loved ones/caregivers in the home care setting.
